The Holy Mass: is the highest form of worship on Earth, there are many fruits and graces that result from having a Mass offered for you. Masses offered for still-living persons (including yourself) are more beneficial than Masses offered for deceased persons. Masses for the dead will provide for them a God-assigned "indulgence" (a curtailing of the duration and/or intensity of purgatorial suffering). But if Mass is offered as intercession for persons while still alive and in the state of grace—i.e., no unrepented serious sin (1 John 5:16), these living persons receive three added benefits not available to the dead, namely:

- Increase of merit (assigned heavenly joy and glory) forever —Catechism of the Catholic Church [CCC] 2010).
- Added sanctifying grace (a deeper sharing in the life of God—2 Pet. 1:4).
- Actual graces (conscience-nudges to do good and avoid evil—CCC 2000).

A reflection from Pope Francis for the Year of Prayer, Prayer sows life, small prayers: this is why it is so important to teach children to pray. Children have to be taught to make the Sign of the Cross properly, because it is the first prayer. Perhaps they may forget, take another path, but the first prayers learned as a child remain in the heart, because they are a seed of life, the seed of dialogue with God.
