### FRUITS OF HOLY COMMUNION

The unity of the Mystical Body: the Eucharist makes the Church. Those who receive the Eucharist are united more closely to Christ. A reflection from Pope Francis for the Year of Prayer, for the Thirtieth Sunday of the Year:

The need for prayer

Pope Francis has said that people should pray more fervently to prepare for the 2025 Jubilee and to experience the power of hope in God. He has also said that prayer is an impulse that arises from within a person, and that it is an intimate mystery. Prayer for others:

Pope Francis has asked Christians to pray for Christian unity and for peace in the world, especially in Ukraine, Israel, Palestine, and Ecuador. He has said that those who suffer the most from the lack of peace are the weakest among us.
